17 AN ACT to Raise Per Diem Compensation
18 for Active Retired Justices and Judges.
19

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
21 follows:

22 Sec. 1. 4 MRSA §6-B, as enacted by PL 1979, c.
23 692, §1, is amended to read:

24 §6-B. Per diem compensation for Active Retired Jus-
25 tices of the Supreme Judicial Court

26 Any Active Retired Justice of the Supreme Judi-
27 cial Court, who performs judicial service at the
28 direction and assignment of the Chief Justice of the
29 Supreme Judicial Court, shall be compensated for
30 those services at the rate of ~~§50~~ §100 per day or ~~§30~~
31 §60 per 1/2 day, provided that the total per diem
32 compensation and retirement pension received by an
33 Active Retired Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court

1 in any calendar year may not exceed the annual salary
2 of a Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court.

3 Sec. 2. 4 MRSA §104-A, as enacted by PL 1979, c.
4 692, §2, is amended to read:

5 §104-A. Per diem compensation for Active Retired
6 Superior Court Justices

7 Any Active Retired Justice of the Superior Court,
8 who performs judicial service at the direction and
9 assignment of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judi-
10 cial Court, shall be compensated for those services
11 at the rate of ~~50~~ 100 per day or ~~30~~ 60 per 1/2
12 day, provided that the total per diem compensation
13 and retirement pension received by an Active Retired
14 Justice of the Superior Court in any calendar year
15 may not exceed the annual salary of a Justice of the
16 Superior Court.

17 Sec. 3. 4 MRSA §157-B, last ¶, as enacted by PL
18 1979, c. 692, §4, is amended to read:

19 Any Active Retired Judge of the District Court,
20 who performs judicial service at the direction and
21 assignment of the Chief Judge of the District Court,
22 shall be compensated for those services at the rate
23 of ~~50~~ 100 per day or ~~30~~ 60 per 1/2 day, provided
24 that the total per diem compensation and retirement
25 pension received by an Active Retired District Court
26 Judge in any calendar year may not exceed the annual
27 salary of a Judge of the District Court.

28 STATEMENT OF FACT

29 The purpose of this bill is to increase the com-
30 pensation of Active Retired Justices and Judges to
31 \$100 per day or \$60 per 1/2 day of judicial service
32 from the present rates of \$50 per day or \$30 per 1/2
33 day.
