12 13 14 15 16 17	The underwater electric cable between Frenchboro and Swan's Island was broken by a scallop dragger in December, 1982. The Town of Frenchboro had no electricity for 4 days. This bill expands the area near cables in which dragging is prohibited, and establishes a one-year mandatory license suspension for persons who violate the provisions.
