AN ACT Regarding the Recording of Instru- ments in the Day Book of the Registry of Deeds.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
33 MRSA §653 is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
§653. Time of recording; attestation
Every register shall, at the time of receiving

and the name of the town or unincorporated place as shown by the instrument in which the property conveyed is located in a book kept for that purpose and open to inspection in business hours. The register shall suffer no deed or instrument for the conveyance of real estate to be altered, amended or withdrawn until it is fully recorded and examined. The records may be attested by the volume, and it shall be deemed to be a sufficient attestation of those records, when each volume bears the attest with the written signature of the register or other person authorized by law to attest those records.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The original bill eliminated most of the information currently required by statute to be written into the day book of a registry of deeds when an instrument conveying property is filed in the registry. The original bill required only the names of the grantor and grantee to be placed in the day book.

This new draft adds 2 more types of information about the instrument that must go into the day book. Along with the names of the grantor and grantee, the register of deeds must write into the day book the time of filing of the instrument and the place where the property conveyed is located.

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
