license valid at the time of issuance of the summons and issued to him or his employer. If the person summoned is an employee of the licensee, he shall show that he was employed by the licensee at the time the summons was issued. If the person summoned shall exhibit to a law enforcement officer designated by the issuing officer such a license or copy thereof, not later than 24 hours before the time set for the court appearance, then the court proceeding shall be dismissed.

 A violation of this section is a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not more than \$200 may be adjudged.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Under present law, itinerant sellers of consumer merchandise are required to be licensed but the employees of the itinerant sellers do not have to be licensed and do not have to carry any evidence of their employer's license. This makes it difficult for law enforcement officers to enforce the law.

The purpose of this bill is to aid law enforcement efforts by requiring all itinerant sellers to carry a copy of their employer's license when they are engaging in the business of itinerant sales in Maine and exhibit a copy on demand of a law enforcement officer.
