AN ACT to Make Allocations from
the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund for the
Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1984, and
June 30, 1985.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the department will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1983; and

1 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
2 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
3 the Constitution of Maine and require the following
4 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-
5 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
6 therefore,

7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
8 follows:

9 Sec. 1. Allocation of Maine Hazardous Waste
10 Fund. Income to the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund for
11 the next 2 fiscal years, from July 1, 1983, to June
12 30, 1984, and from July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985,
13 shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as
14 designated in the following schedule:

33 may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget
34 Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifi-
35 cally cover those adjustments determined to be neces-
36 sary under any salary plan approved by the Legis-
37 lature and those reclassifications/range changes
