fog, rain, freezing rain, snow or other forms of 1 inclement atmospheric conditions or otherwise, per-2 3 sons and vehicles on the highways are not clearly 4 discernible at a distance of 500 feet ahead. This 5 section shall not apply to any vehicle which is designed to be propelled by hand, nor to any vehicle 6 7 not in motion and parked or beside a curb in a place 8 and under conditions where there is sufficient arti-9 ficial light to make such that vehicle clearly visible from a distance not less than 100 feet in each 10 direction. "Sunrise" and "sunset" shall be the time 11 12 given in the Maine Farmers' Almanac.

STATEMENT OF FACT

14 The purpose of this bill is to more clearly de-15 fine inclement weather conditions which require oper-16 ators to turn on headlights and taillights during 17 daylight.

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
