STATE OF MAINE
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE
AN ACT to Increase the Penalty for Nonpayment of Reportable Wages under the Unemployment Compensation Laws.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
26 MRSA §1051, sub-§§1 to 3, as repealed and replaced by PL 1979, c. 515, §9, are amended to read:
1. False statement or representation. A person is guilty of unemployment fraud if he makes a false statement or representation knowing it to be false or knowingly fails to disclose a material fact:
A. To obtain or increase any benefit or other payment under this chapter or under an employment security law of any other state or of the Federal Government;

- 1 B. To prevent or reduce the payment of unemploy-2 ment benefits to any individual;
- C. To avoid becoming or remaining an employer
 under this ehater chapter; or
- 5 D. To avoid or reduce any contribution or other 6 payment required from an employing unit under 7 this chapter.

8 Each false statement or representation or failure to
9 disclose a material fact shall contitute a
10 separate offense. Unemployment fraud is a Class E
11 Class D crime.

12 2. <u>Separate offense</u>. Any person who willfully 13 fails or refuses to make any contributions or other 14 payments, to furnish any reports required by this 15 chapter or to produce or permit the inspection or 16 copying of records as required shall be is guilty of 17 a Glass E <u>Class</u> D crime. Each failure or refusal 18 shall constitute a separate offense.

3. <u>Class D crime</u>. Any person who willfully violates any provision of this chapter or any regulation thereunder, the violation of which is made unlawful or the observance of which is required under the terms of this chapter, and for which a penalty is neither prescribed herein nor provided by any other applicable statute, shall be is guilty of a Glass E Class D crime.

STATEMENT OF FACT

28 This bill increases the penalty for making false 29 statements or representations under the labor laws 30 from a Class E to a Class D crime.
