AN ACT to Allocate Moneys for the
Administrative Expenses of the State
Lottery Commission for the Fiscal Years
Ending June 30, 1984, and June 30, 1985.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the State Lottery Commission will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1983; and

1 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
2 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
3 the Constitution of Maine and require the following
4 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-
5 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
6 therefore,

7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
8 follows:

9 Sec. 1. Allocation of fund. In order to provide
10 the necessary expenses for operation and administra-
11 tion of the State Lottery Commission, the following
12 amounts, or as much as may be necessary, are allo-
13 cated from the revenues derived from operations of
14 the fund.

22 Sec. 2. Allotments required. Upon receipt of
23 allotments duly approved by the Governor based upon
24 work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer,
25 the State Controller shall authorize expenditures
26 from these allocations on the basis of these allot-
27 ments and not otherwise.

28 Sec. 3. Legislative intent. It is the intent of
29 the Legislature that the allocation of funds by the
30 Legislature, as provided by this Act, shall apply to
31 the operating expenses only and that these alloca-
32 tions shall be allotted and approved under the
33 Revised Statutes, Title 5.

34 Sec. 4. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations
35 may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget
36 Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifi-
37 cally cover those adjustments determined to be neces-
38 sary under any salary plan approved by the Legis-
