12 13 14	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

- and Cultural Services to provide timely and thorough firefighter training to private industrial brigades, it is necessary to allow the department to charge a reasonable fee for the training; and
 - Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
- 11 Further amend the Bill by inserting at the end 12 before the statement of fact the following:
 - 'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this amendment is to add an emergency to the bill. The need for training of private industrial fire brigades is obvious. They are the first line of defense in a fire at an industrial site. Their action may mean the difference between protecting not only the plant, but the community in which it is located. Because of the likelihood that the industrial site will contain one or more hazardous substances which may react in dangerous and unpredictable ways with fire, special training of fire brigades is essential. The companies themselves recognize that fact; and several have requested training. They appear to be willing to pay a reasonable fee for the training.
