17 RESOLVE, Authorizing the Director of Parks  
18 and Recreation to Convey by Deed the Interest  
19 of the State of Maine in 3 Certain Parcels  
20 of Real Property.  
21

22 Director of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation;  
23 property conveyed by quitclaim deed. Resolved: That  
24 the Director of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation  
25 may convey by quitclaim deed and for no monetary con-  
26 sideration the following properties:

27 1. To the inhabitants of the Town of Rockport,  
28 a parcel containing 3.7+ acres known as Rockport  
29 Marine Park, as acquired from George Stevenson, et  
30 al, by deed, dated August 28, 1970, and recorded at  
31 the Knox County Registry of Deeds in Book 511, page  
32 424;

33 2. To the inhabitants of the Town of Bristol,  
34 certain real property containing 5.3+ acres known as

1 the Pemaquid River Boat Facility Property, as ac-  
2 quired from Carl M. Hanna and Katherine B. Hanna, by  
3 deed, dated December 30, 1970, and recorded at the  
4 Lincoln County Registry of Deeds in Book 683, page  
5 189; and

6 3. To the inhabitants of the Town of Mt.  
7 Desert, certain real property containing 2.66+ acres  
8 known as the Long Pond Boat Access Site, as acquired  
9 from Luzetta S. Smith, et al, by deed, dated January  
10 18, 1971, and recorded at the Hancock County Registry  
11 of Deeds in Book 1111, page 595.

12 Each shall be on such terms and conditions and  
13 for such consideration, as the director may direct.

14 STATEMENT OF FACT

15 The 3 properties proposed to be conveyed were ac-  
16 quired for public boat access purposes. During the  
17 period since acquisition, the use and operation of  
18 each facility has shown the facilities to be of  
19 local, rather than of state or regional significance,  
20 indicating the propriety of municipal ownership and  
21 operation. Provisions for continuing and  
22 nondiscriminating operation of boat access and  
23 related outdoor recreation uses would be contained in  
24 any deeds of conveyance.

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
