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AN ACT Making Allocations Related to the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1984, and June 30, 1985.

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Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

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Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the department will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1983; and

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1 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
2 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
3 the Constitution of Maine and require the following
4 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-
5 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
6 therefore,

7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
8 follows:

9 Sec. 1. Allocation. The following funds are
10 allocated from the Alcoholism Prevention, Education,
11 Treatment and Research Fund for the fiscal years
12 ending June 30, 1984, and June 30, 1985.

28 Sec. 2. Coordination. The Department of Correc-
29 tions, Department of Educational and Cultural Ser-
30 vices, Department of Human Services and Department of
31 Mental Health and Mental Retardation shall coordinate
32 to the greatest extent possible their goals, educa-
33 tion, treatment, training, prevention and research
34 programs. Before expending any education and train-
35 ing funds, a department shall submit the plans for
36 the program to a joint planning group established by
37 the departments to ensure coordination of policy and
38 service.
