-	AN ACT Regarding Requirements to Reactivate an Inactive Real Estate Agent License.
	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	<b>32 MRSA §4118-A, last paragraph</b> , as repealed and replaced by PL 1979, c. 196, §3, is amended to read:
	Anyone who has surrendered his license pursuant
	to this section and who applies for reinstatement of
	his license to active status shall be subject to all
	the provisions of this chapter applicable to an orig- inal applicant for a license except written examina-
	tion and fee. The licensee shall demonstrate to the
	commission that he has within the previous biennium
	attended 12 clock hours of courses designated in
	section 4115-B by rule of the commission as fulfill-
	ing the requirements to reactivate a license, includ-

1 ing any specific core courses the commission may
2 demand.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

4 This bill allows the Real Estate Commission 5 greater control over the courses required for an 6 inactive broker or salesperson to renew his license. The educational needs of these agents may be substan-7 tially different from those of active licensees whose 8 9 continuing education requirement is contained in Title 32, section 4115-B. This provision allows the 10 commission to develop a meaningful core curriculum 11 12 which addresses the actual needs of inactive licensees. For example, courses in recent developments in the law and modern financing techniques might demand 13 14 15 this sort of treatment.

16 This bill does not increase the course burden on 17 licensees; rather, it recognizes the public interest 18 in assuring the competence of agents who may be 19 returning to practice after an indeterminate length 20 of time.
