17 AN ACT to Set the On-premise Liquor
18 License Fees in Accordance with Population.
19

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
21 follows:

22 28 MRSA §701, sub-§1, as enacted PL 1975, c. 741,
23 §21, is repealed and the following enacted in its
24 place:

25 1. Fees for full-year licenses. Fees for
26 full-year licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages
27 for on-premise consumption of liquor shall be as
28 follows:

29 A. Class I License, spirituous, vinous and malt
30 beverages:

31 In municipalities having population of 5,000 or
32 less \$ 600

3	<u>(1) Class I-A License -- optional license</u>

1 Population shall be determined according to each Fed-
2 eral Decennial Census as shown by any official report
3 authorized by the United States Census Act and shall
4 apply to the licensing period next following that
5 official report.
