21 22 23	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
24 25 26	Whereas, the law permitting the reserving and enforcement of special handicapped parking spaces was enacted in 1982; and
27 28 29	Whereas, that law requires a handicapped parking warning to contain 2 forms of notice that the space is reserved for handicapped parking; and
30 31 32 33	Whereas, many facilities already have signs that provide one form of warning but not both, making them legally insufficient as a proper warning under the law; and

Whereas, this legislation proposes to amend the law so that either form of warning is sufficient; and

40 41 Whereas, unless enacted as an emergency, the public purpose behind handicapped parking designation will be further delayed; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

14 30 MRSA §2151, sub-§2, ¶K, as enacted by PL 1981,
15 c. 587, is amended to read:

Providing for the establishment and policing of parking spaces designated for handicapped permunicipality with off-street public Α parking areas may set aside an adequate number of these spaces for use by handicapped persons. municipality with on-street public parking spaces may set aside an adequate number of these spaces in appropriate locations for use by handicapped There shall be adjacent to and visible persons. from each handicapped parking space a posted sign consisting of a profile view of a wheelchair with occupant in white on a blue background and, a sign bearing the following warning: "Handicapped Parking: Special Plate Required. Unauthorized vehicles are subject to a fine."; or any other sign or symbol that clearly designates that the space is reserved for handicapped parking only. Any vehicle parked in a parking space designated by a municipality as a handicapped parking space that does not bear a special registration plate or placard issued under Title 29, section 252, or a similar plate issued by another state, shall be cited for a penalty not to exceed \$25 unless otherwise established by local ordinance. private off-street parking may enter into agreements with local or county law enforcement agencies for the policing of stalls and spaces dedicated for handicapped persons' vehicles, under which agreements unauthorized vehicles shall be tagged.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to increase the number of designations that may be used to identify handicapped parking spaces. Under current law, to be properly designated a handicapped parking space, the space must contain a sign with both the universal handicapped symbol and the verbal warning. Many spaces only have one or the other of these notices. This bill permits the use of either of these forms of notice or any other sign or symbol that clearly identifies the parking space as being reserved for handicapped persons.
