17 AN ACT to Extend the National School  
18 Breakfast Program Availability to Maine  
19 School Children.

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
22 follows:

23 20-A MRSA §6602, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1981,  
24 c. 693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:

25 1. Participation. A public school shall par-  
26 ticipate in the National School Lunch Program. It  
27 shall provide Type A meals as determined by the  
28 United States Department of Agriculture. A public  
29 school designated as especially needy shall be re-  
30 quired to participate in the National School  
31 Breakfast Program by July 1, 1984. The commissioner  
32 shall designate a school as especially needy whenever  
33 50% or more of the children in attendance are eligi-

1 ble for free or reduced price meals under applicable  
2 federal regulations.

3 STATEMENT OF FACT

4 This bill requires public schools with a high  
5 percentage of needy children enrolled to participate  
6 in the National School Breakfast Program by July 1,  
7 1985.
