## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill revises the salary levels which determine whether law enforcement officers are considered "full time" or "part time." In order to achieve consistency, a parallel change is included for corrections' officers.

The recommended change is consistent with the fact that wages generally have risen in this field since the present amount was set.

Because the training laws set more stringent requirements on officers earning above the statutory level, some jurisdictions may be unable or unwilling to hire part-time officers who, as "full-time" officers under the statute, would require training at additional costs.
