25	§2481. Definitions.											
26 27 28	As used in this chapter, unless the context indi- cates otherwise, the following terms have the follow- ing meanings.											
29 30 31	1. Blaster. "Blaster" means a person who per- forms the act of preparation for detonation and the detonation of an explosive.											

- 12. Commissioner."Commissioner" means the Com-2missioner of Public Safety.
- 3 §2482. Certification required
- 4 <u>1. Blasters. No person may act as a blaster</u> 5 <u>unless he has been certified under this chapter.</u>

Employers. No employer, contractor or agent
of an employer or contractor may knowingly permit any
person to act as a blaster if that person has not
been certified under this chapter.

10 §2483. Administration

11 <u>1. Commissioner. The commissioner, in consulta-</u> 12 <u>tion with the State Fire Marshal and subject to the</u> 13 provisions of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act 14 <u>Title 5, chapter 375, shall promulgate rules govern-</u> 15 <u>ing the certification of blasters. The rules include</u> 16 provisions for the following:

- 17A. Both a written and an oral examination to be18successfully completed by each applicant;
- 19 B. The contents of the application; and
- 20C. Any age, experience or other requirements the
commissioner finds necessary and proper.

22 2. Fee. The commissioner shall establish the
23 schedule of fees for certification, examinations and
24 other services performed in connection with the
25 administration of this chapter. Fees shall be calcu26 lated to adequately cover costs of administration,
27 but no fee may exceed \$50.

28 §2484. Penalties

1. Person acting as a blaster without certification. Any person who acts as a blaster, knowing that
he is not certified to do so under this chapter, is
guilty of a Class D crime.

33 2. Employer or contractor allowing uncertified
 34 person to act as blaster. Any employer, contractor
 35 or agent of an employer or contractor who knowingly
