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STATEMENT OF FACT

Medical examiners have had no increase in their fees for a considerable period of time. The amount paid currently is \$30 for viewing and inspecting, and 20¢ per mile for travel. In rural areas where time is consumed in travel, this fee is unreasonably small. This bill will increase the fee to \$75, and travel to be at the rate for state employees, currently set at 22¢ per mile.

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
