23	SUBCHAPTER III
24 25	PLACEMENT AND THERAPEUTIC SERVICES FOR NONRETARDED DEPENDENT AND INCAPACITATED ADULTS
26	§3488. Placement
27 28 29 30 31 32	When it has been determined that an incapacitated or dependent adult is in need of placement in a non-medical licensed or approved facility and the cost of placement, in whole or in part, is state funded, the adult shall be assessed prior to placement for the purpose of identifying the needed level of care.

1 §3489. Levels

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There shall be 4 levels of placement available for dependent or incapacitated adults.

- 1. Level one. The adult presents no significant management problems and has activity for daily living needs which are consistent with mental illness in remission.
- 8 2. Level 2. The adult may exhibit psychosis 9 which is manageable with medication and may pose 10 occasional behavioral problems of limited duration.
- 3. Level 3. The adult may exhibit inappropriate social and emotional behavior and may intermittently present self-abusive, destructive or aggressive behavior.
- 15 4. Level 4. The adult presents significant 16 mental health or substance abuse problems and is in 17 need of intensive services, including therapy.

18 §3490. Therapeutic services

In addition to care and maintenance, a group of alternative care services shall be available to preserve or improve an incapacitated or dependent adult's physical and mental functioning and independence. Care, maintenance and services shall be provided according to individual study plans.

25 §3491. Reimbursement to facilities providing 26 therapeutic services

Facilities provide level 3 care shall be eligible for a 40% rate increase above the rate established for the facility and in accordance with section 7907, or \$120 a month, whichever is the lesser amount. Facilities providing level 4 care shall be eligible for a 50% rate increase above the rate established for the facility and in accordance with section 7907, or \$150 a month, whichever is the lesser amount.

§3492. Training team

1 2 3	There shall be an identified training team within the department for the purpose of providing ongoing training for facility staff and placement workers.

5 6 7 8	The department may adopt rules in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II, to carry out this chapter.
9	STATEMENT OF FACT
10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17	This bill provides therapeutic services and facilities for incapacitated and dependent adults. Gaps in the existing continuum of care will be addressed by providing new levels of care in licensed and approved facilities, and new facilities through recruitment. This bill facilitates the use of least restrictive living arrangements and measures for those in need of therapeutic services and facilities.
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
