STATEMENT OF FACT

18 Patients who are eligible for Medicare pay an annual deductible fee, and 20% of the usual, reason-19 20 able and customary charges for covered services pro-21 vided by a physician. The remaining 80% is paid by 22 Medicare if the physician agrees to Medicare assign-23 ment. If the physician does not accept Medicare assignment, the patient must pay the annual deduct-24 25 ible, the 20% and the amount charged by the physician 26 which is above the usual, reasonable and customary 27 charges.

At present, Medicare-eligible patients have no convenient way to determine which physicians accept Medicare assignment. The bill would provide a central list, which would be available at all Department of Human Services offices.

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
