STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide county commissioners with the flexibility to decide whether or not county personnel board members shall be compensated. Present law requires that they be paid, yet some counties use volunteer members where payment is not expected but where it must be made. This bill corrects that problem.
