AN ACT Concerning the Compensation of  
County Personnel Board Members.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

30 MRSA §1132, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 431, §16, is amended to read:

§1132. Membership, term and compensation

The county personnel board shall be composed of not less than 3 nor more than 5 members who shall not be county officers or employees. The members shall be appointed by the county commissioners. The terms of the members shall be 3 years, except that for the first appointment there shall be one appointed for one year, one for 2 years and one for 3 years. Vacan-

1 cies shall be filled for the remainder of the term of  
2 the vacated appointment. The board shall elect its  
3 own chairman annually. The members ~~shall~~ may receive  
4 \$25 a day for the time actually spent in the dis-  
5 charge of their duties and their necessary expenses.

6 STATEMENT OF FACT

7 The purpose of this bill is to provide county  
8 commissioners with the flexibility to decide whether  
9 or not county personnel board members shall be com-  
10 pensated. Present law requires that they be paid,  
11 yet some counties use volunteer members where payment  
12 is not expected but where it must be made. This bill  
13 corrects that problem.

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
