Whoever, after bei requested or signaled to stop, attempts to elude aw enforcement officer by driving a vehicle at eackless rate of speed which results in a high-spe thase between the operator's vehicle and any 1 inforcement vehicle using a blue light or siren pullty of a Class D crime. If any person suffers a personal injury as a result of the operator's attempts.			FIRST R	EGULAR SE	ESSION	
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1 Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §2501-A, sub-§4, as enacted by 2 PL 1981, c. 117, §3, is amended to read:

3 4. Passing a roadblock. It is unlawful for the operator of any motor vehicle to pass or attempt to 4 5 pass a roadblock, clearly identifiable as a police 6 roadblock, without authorization. Failure to comply 7 with this subsection is a Class C crime. If any 8 person suffers personal injury as a result of an operator's passing or attempting to pass a roadblock 9 10 in violation of this subsection, that operator com-11 mits a Class B crime.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

13 This bill upgrades the motor vehicle crimes of 14 eluding a police officer or passing a roadblock if 15 personal injury results to any person - police offi-16 cer, vehicle operator or innocent bystander.

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
