2. Study. The committee shall study the feasibility of establishing a public electric power authority in Aroostook County to generate and sell electricity, to develop energy conservation programs and to develop alternate energy sources, but not to engage in distribution of electricity for public use.

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- 3. Findings. The committee shall report its findings to the voters of the State by September 3, 1984. Within 90 days of the final report, the committee shall circulate its draft findings for public comment and shall present them in at least 3 public hearings, 2 in Aroostook County. The final report shall address the comments received.
- 4. Report based on study. The report shall be based on an objective, unbiased study to be performed by a competent contractor selected by the committee. The committee shall have responsibility for oversight of the contract. That study shall consider:
- 19 A. The experience with public power in other 20 states;
- B. The financial implications of public power for electric rates and for bonding capability;
- C. The implications of public, as contrasted to private, decision making on electric power planning;
 - D. The legal implications of public power, including the federal tax implications and the ability of a subdivision of the State to pledge the credit of the State;
- 30 E. A survey of possible generating facilities 31 which could be acquired or constructed by a 32 public power authority in Aroostook County; and
- F. Such other items as the committee requires.
- 5. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Legislative Account for the work of the Joint Select Committee on Public Power, including expenses for the study specified in subsection 4, for expert witness and for travel and per diem expenses, the sum of \$25,000.

Sec. 2. Referendum. The following question shall be submitted to the voters of the State in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at the general election in the month of November, 1984. The city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:

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"Shall a public electric power authority be established in Aroostook County to generate and sell electricity, to develop energy conservation programs, and to develop alternate energy sources?"

legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below the words "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, declared and in open ward, town plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns, and if it appears that a majority of the are in favor of the Act, the Governor legal votes shall proclaim that fact without delay. In the event that the voters approve the question, the Legislature shall enact such legislation as may be necessary to implement the creation of the public power authority by June 30, 1985.

The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this referendum necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Electric power is an essential service and many citizens have been hurt by rising electric rates. Planning for the provision of that service, although regulated by the Public Utilities Commission, has been primarily a matter of private corporate decision.

Particularly in Aroostook County, certain decisions on new generating facilities are causing severe financial difficulties for both the consumers and the utilities.

 This bill provides for a careful unbiased professional study comparing public and private power for the generation of electricity, development of energy conservation programs and the development of alternate energy sources.

On the basis of that study, the voters in referendum would then have the opportunity to decide whether to establish a public power authority in Aroostook County.

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
