23 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-  
24 lature do not become effective until 90 days after  
25 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

26 Whereas, an exemption from property tax for nat-  
27 urally occurring metallic minerals will take effect  
28 on March 1, 1983; and

29 Whereas, a March, 1983 effective date was chosen  
30 with the hope that a constitutional amendment would  
31 be approved to remove the requirement of reimburse-  
32 ment for minerals exemptions; and

33 Whereas, time did not permit consideration by the  
34 voters of a constitutional amendment; and
