Amend the bill by striking out all of the title  
and inserting in its place the following:

Further amend the bill by striking out everything  
after the amending clause and inserting in its place  
the following:

'5-A. A person convicted of a 2nd or subsequent  
violation of any combination of the following sec-  
tions shall be sentenced to a minimum term of impris-  
onment of 10 days, which shall not be suspended:

A. Unlawful trafficking under section 1103,

The purpose of this amendment is to limit the  
mandatory sentencing provisions to situations involv-  
ing a 2nd or subsequent offense involving trafficking  
drugs. This amendment removes from the bill situa-  
tions dealing only with furnishing drugs. The Maine  
Criminal Code defines "trafficking," as including,  
making, creating, manufacturing, selling, bartering,  
trading, exchanging or otherwise furnishing for con-  
sideration. "Furnishing," includes furnishing,

1 giving, dispensing, administering, prescribing,  
2 delivering or otherwise transferring to another  
3 person. The amendment provides mandatory sentencing  
4 for drug dealers, but does not include a person who  
5 gives a drug to another.
