16 17 18 19	'5-A. A person convicted of a 2nd or subsequent violation of any combination of the following sections shall be sentenced to a minimum term of imprisonment of 10 days, which shall not be suspended:

22 23	B. Violation of section 1111-A, subsection 5 or 6.'
24	Statement of Fact
25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32	The purpose of this amendment is to limit the mandatory sentencing provisions to situations involving a 2nd or subsequent offense involving trafficking drugs. This amendment removes from the bill situations dealing only with furnishing drugs. The Maine Criminal Code defines "trafficking," as including, making, creating, manufacturing, selling, bartering, trading, exchanging or otherwise furnishing for consideration. "Furnishing," includes furnishing,

giving, dispensing, administering, prescribing, delivering or otherwise transferring to another person. The amendment provides mandatory sentencing for drug dealers, but does not include a person who gives a drug to another.
