3 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES (Filing No. H-47) 4 111TH LEGISLATURE 5 FIRST REGULAR SESSION HOUSE AMENDMENT """ to 6 H.P. 742, L.D. 929, 7 Bill, "AN ACT to Require Mandatory Jail Sentences for Trafficking or Furnishing Drugs." 8 9 Amend the bill by striking out all of the title 10 and inserting in its place the following: 11 'AN ACT to Require Mandatory Jail Sentences for 12 Trafficking Drugs. 13 Further amend the bill by striking out everything 14 after the amending clause and inserting in its place 15 the following: '5-A. A person convicted of a 2nd or subsequent violation of any combination of the following sec-16 17 tions shall be sentenced to a minimum term of impris-onment of 10 days, which shall not be suspended: 18 19 20 Unlawful trafficking under sections 1103, 1104, 1105 and 1110. 21 22 Statement of Fact 23 The purpose of this amendment is to limit the mandatory sentencing provisions to situations involv-ing a 2nd or subsequent offense involving trafficking 24 25 drugs. This amendment removes from the bill situa-26 27 tions dealing only with furnishing drugs. The Maine Criminal Code defines "trafficking," as including, 28 making, creating, manufacturing, selling, bartering, trading, exchanging or otherwise furnishing for con-29 30 "Furnishing," includes furnishing, 31 sideration. 32 giving, dispensing, administering, prescribing, delivering or otherwise transferring to another 33 34 person. Thus the amendment provides mandatory sen-
