The State, through the board of trustees, shall pay the same percentage of the premium for retired state employee's dependent coverage as the State pays for active employee's dependent coverage. The State shall also pay the premium for Medicare, Part B, for retired state employees who are eligible for Medicare payments.

 Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill equalizes the treatment of retired state employees under the accident and sickness or health insurance program. The State presently pays the premium for health insurance for the individual state employee or retiree and 50% of the principle for dependents covered by the policy of the active employee only. This bill requires that the State pay 50% of dependent coverage premium for retired state employees.

In addition, retired state employees who are not eligible for Medicare have their individual health insurance coverage paid by the State. Those who are Medicare eligible must pay for Medicare, Part B, which covers physician services. This bill requires the State to pay the Medicare, Part B premium for those retired state employees so covered.
