Preamble. Wherea common problems in agricultural resource pels a closer workin offer potential for diversified nature, nomic position of our	s, the Legislature finds that the effective utilization of our base, natural and human, com- g relationship on projects which more food production of a not only to strengthen the eco- rural areas, but also to ensure ficiency for the region; and

Whereas, the Legislature declares that it attaches importance to the pursuit of common goals in the field of agriculture. It is prepared to offer financial and other forms of support on a matching basis with neighboring states and provinces and with private foundations, to foster research, planning, development and communications projects which aim to strengthen the region's capacity to develop sustainable agricultural practices and activities; and

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Whereas, through cooperation and the sharing of resources, development work can begin and continue to build a more productive and diversified agricultural community on a regional basis, comprised of small to mid-sized family farms. Pooling scarce resources can insure that states and provinces which have contemplated developmental projects beyond affordability by individual states and provinces alone, can secure adequate financial and auxiliary support to pursue activities producing regional dividends; and

Whereas, initially, the Legislature suggests that regional cooperation can be best encouraged through the support of information exchange projects which concentrate on the transfer of vital information already assembled to promote diversified and intensive production of farm and forest products. example, the Maine Public Broadcasting Service already developed a pilot television program, called the Small Farm Journal, which effectively relays information to farmers about various production techand equipment options. The station in Maine has been seeking financial backing for several develop a comprehensive series of media programs related to farm production alternatives, but as yet fund-raising attempts have not produced the necessary of financial support. Another example of the use of communications technology is providing the opportunity for farmers, farm groups, university and extension officials, and Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources' personnel to exchange pracinformation in a timely fashion without having to travel great distances from farm or place of work. The use of computers in a teleconferencing system used in the human services field in northern New England states could have appropriate applications to rural development efforts in the region; and

Whereas, later on, common goals in the marketing areas can be pursued, such as emphasizing regional pooling of supplies of products to penetrate larger wholesale markets beyond the reach of small growers and to review existing marketing structures with an aim to increasing efficiency and avoiding unproductive duplication of efforts; now, therefore, be it

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Regional Agriculture Committee; established. That there is established in Maine a Resolved: Regional Agriculture Committee to insure that policy is faithfully pursued and to which matching funds will be entrusted to stimulate and support beneficial projects. The committee shall consist of 9 members: The Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, who will be the chairman; Director of the Maine Canadian Legislative Advisory Commission; Director of the Cooperative Extension Service; members of the Legislature, one appointed by the President of the Senate and one appointed by the Speaker of the House; representation from 2 different farm organizations, one associated with an established major commodity crop, such as apples, potatoes, milk, etc., and the other associated with a more diversified farm production unit chosen by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources; and a consumer, nonfarmer, representative and a representative of the communications-media field, appointed by the Governor; and be it further

Duties of committee. Resolved: That the Regional Agriculture Committee shall meet at least once a year, but not more than 4 times in a calendar year to:

- 1. Review proposals from public and private non-profit institutions in Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Quebec and the Maritimes which aim to strengthen the agricultural capacity of the region;
- 2. Establish conditions for the application of matching funds to support projects, insuring that results will be adequately disseminated in a timely fashion;
 - 3. Administer matching funds made available to it by the Legislature and other sources for the pur-

poses stated and to prepare an annual financial
report, along with a written account of investment
practices and matching donors;

- 4. Report annually to the Legislature to share information about the activities of the committee and the benefits achieved as a result of matching grants extended; and
- 5. Recommend to the Legislature continued levels of financial support, if necessary and advisable; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the Legislature appropriate \$25,000 to be made available to the Regional Agriculture Committee for fiscal year 1983-84, and \$25,000 to be made available in fiscal year 1984-85.

16 STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve instructs the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to form the Regional Agriculture Committee for the purpose of matching funds from neighboring states in New England and provinces in Canada to support projects designed to strengthen the agricultural sector of the region.

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
