ing the following warning: "Handicapped Parking: 1 Special Plate Required. Unauthorized vehicles are subject to a fine." Any vehicle parked in a 2 3 parking space designated by a municipality as 4 а 5 handicapped parking space that does not bear a special registration plate or placard issued under Title 29, section 252, or a similar plate issued by another state, shall be cited for a 6 7 8 penalty not to exceed \$25 ± 50 unless otherwise 9 10 established by local ordinance. Owners of pri-11 vate off-street parking may enter into agreements with local or county law enforcement agencies for 12 the policing of stalls and spaces dedicated for 13 handicapped persons' vehicles, under which agree-14 15 ments unauthorized vehicles shall be tagged.
