and upon the completion of that term the position shall carry a 7-year term. Two other members shall be currently enrolled sophomore or junior undergraduate students, no more than one of whom may be enrolled at the Orono campus. A student member of the board shall serve a 2-year term or until the graduation of the class of which the student trustee is a member, whichever occurs first. No person appointed to the board may also be a current member of the State Board of Education.

All terms of office, except those of student members, shall expire on May 26th of the appropriate year, except that a member shall continue to serve until a successor trustee has been appointed and qualified to assume office. Any vacancy shall be filled by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and to confirmation by the Legislature, for the unexpired balance of the term. Trustees are eligible for reappointment only once, except that any trustee appointed to fill a vacancy where the unexpired balance of the term is 3 years or less, shall be eligible for reappointment for 2 full 7-year terms. Trustees shall retire on reaching the age of 70. In order to restore and maintain rotation of terms of office of trustees, an incumbent trustee who was appointed for a term of 7 years at a time subsequent to the expiration of the term of his predecessor in office, shall be deemed to have commenced his 7-year term upon the date of the expiration of the term of office of his predecessor rather than from the date of his appointment and qualification.

Trustees shall serve without pay, but shall receive their actual traveling and other expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties. The board of trustees shall, when practicable, meet from time to time at each of the various campuses of the university.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill expands the size of the University of Maine Board of Trustees by 4 members. Two are to be

tenured faculty members, only one of whom may teach at the Orono campus. The 2 other new trustees are to be sophomore or junior undergraduate students who will only serve 2-year terms. The bill makes no other substantive changes in the organization of the board.

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
