STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This bill clarifies recent questions as to 3 whether the Public Utilities Commission retains 4 jurisdiction over the revenues produced by the direc-5 tory operations of telephone companies. Telephone directories, both alphabetical and classified, are 6 а 7 public service and are, therefore, a part of the In calcu-8 normal operations of a telephone company. lating the cost of telephone service, the commission 9 10 has historically considered the revenues, expenses and net operating income of the classified advertis-11 12 ing directory (yellow pages) operations of each com-13 pany. In doing so, the commission's primary concern 14 is that a telephone company obtain maximum revenue 15 from its advertising operations, so that the amount 16 of revenue to be obtained from basic local telephone 17 service may be reduced as much as possible.

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
