- 1 6. All-terrain vehicle. "All-terrain vehicle"
 2 means any multi-wheeled vehicle propelled by mechani3 cal power not to exceed 35 horsepower equipped with
 4 balloon tires each of which contains 5 pounds of
 5 pressure or less and designed for off-road use exclusively.

9 §7822. Application

This subchapter shall apply to the operation of snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles in all areas which come within the jurisdiction of the State.

- 13 Sec. 4. 12 MRSA §7823, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 14 420, §1, is amended to read:
- 15 §7823. License
- No operator's license is required for the operation of a snowmobile or an all-terrain vehicle.

20 §7824. Registration

- 1. Application and issuance. The commissioner, or an agent designated by him, may register and assign a registration number to all snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles upon application and payment of an annual fee by the owner. A registration shall be valid for one year commencing July 1st of each year.
- 27 2. Fee. The annual snowmobile registration fee is \$11. $\overline{25}$ and the annual all-terrain vehicle registration fee is \$10.75.
- 30
 Allocation of fees.
- 31 A. The registration fee for residents shall be credited as follows:
- 33 (1) \$4.75 of each fee shall be credited to the department;

- 1 (2) 50¢ of each <u>snowmobile</u> fee shall be 2 credited to the Snowmobile Trail Fund of the 3 Bureau of Parks and Recreation; and
 - (3) \$6 of each fee shall be annually distributed to the municipality of the owner's residence as shown on his registration certificate, except that in unorganized townships, \$6 of each fee shall be annually distributed to the county of the owner's residence as shown on his registration certificate.
 - B. The registration fee for nonresidents shall be credited as follows:
 - (1) \$10.75 of each snowmobile fee and the entire all-terrain vehicle fee shall be credited to the department; and
 - (2) 50¢ of each <u>snowmobile</u> fee shall be credited to the Snowmobile Trail Fund of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation.
 - C. All other moneys received under this subchapter, including dealer license fees, shall be credited to the department.
 - 4. Use of fees.

- A. All moneys credited to the department, including registration fees, shall be expended by the department solely for the cost of administration, establishment of a safety program for snow-mobile operators and enforcement of this subchapter.
- B. The Bureau of Parks and Recreation is authorized to may use the moneys credited to the Snowmobile Trail Fund of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation to make grants-in-aid to political subdivisions, educational institutions, regional planning agencies, snowmobile groups and others for the construction and maintenance of snowmobile trails and for research, development and planning of snowmobile trails on such terms as the bureau determines necessary.

(1) The bureau shall determine what trails will be eligible.

- (2) The bureau may charge a reasonable fee for these services and materials when the moneys credited to it under this paragraph are insufficient to satisfy the demand for the services and materials. All fees so collected shall be deposited in the Snowmobile Trail Fund of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation.
- (3) If any of these moneys are not expended during the year in which they are collected, the unexpended balance shall not lapse, but shall be carried as a continuing account available for the purposes specified until expended.
- C. The Bureau of Parks and Recreation is authorized to may use moneys credited to the Snowmobile Trail Fund of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation for snowmobile trail acquisition, including, but not limited to, the purchase or lease of real estate and the acquisition of easements, construction, development, planning and maintenance and for providing educational and informational materials for the use of operators of snowmobiles and for research.
- D. The moneys distributed to the municipalities by the department may be appropriated by the municipalities for any purpose for which they may lawfully appropriate moneys.
- E. The moneys distributed to the counties by the department may be appropriated by the counties for use in the unorganized townships where the fee was payable.
- 5. Form of registration. The snowmobile and all-terrain vehicle registration shall be in such form as the commissioner may determine.
 - 6. <u>Duplicate registration certificate</u>. The holder of any registration certificate issued under this section may obtain a duplicate from the commis-

- 1 sioner upon application and payment of a fee of \$1.
- Numbers permanent. All numbers once awarded under this section to a snowmobile and an all-terrain vehicle shall remain with that snowmobile all-terrain vehicle until the snowmobile or <u>all-terrain vehicle</u> is destroyed, abandoned or permanently removed from this State, except that numbers that have been inactive for at least 7 years may be reissued by the division.
- 10 8. Transfer of ownership or discontinuance of 11 use.

- A. Whoever transfers the ownership or permanently discontinues the use of a registered snow-mobile or an all-terrain vehicle and applies for registration of another snowmobile or all-terrain vehicle in the same registration year shall be entitled to a certificate of registration upon payment of a transfer fee of \$2 and shall not be required to pay the regular registration fee ef \$11.25.
- B. Whenever ownership is transferred or the use of a snowmobile or an all-terrain vehicle for which a registration certificate has already been issued is discontinued, the old registration certificate shall be properly signed and executed by the owner showing that the ownership of the snowmobile or all-terrain vehicle has been transferred or its use discontinued and returned to the commissioner within 10 days of the transfer or discontinuance of use.
- C. If there is a change of ownership of a snow-mobile <u>or an all-terrain vehicle</u> for which a registration certificate number has previously been issued, the new owner shall apply for a new registration certificate, shall set forth the original number in the application and shall pay the regular fee for the particular snowmobile <u>or</u> all-terrain vehicle involved.
- 39 9. <u>Reciprocity</u>. Reciprocity shall be allowed to 40 nonresidents from all states, provinces, countries or 41 districts which allow similar privileges to residents

- of this State, providing they are covered by a valid registration from that state, province, country or district.
- A. If the snowmobile <u>or all-terrain vehicle</u> is owned by a nonresident, but is primarily operated by a Maine resident, it must be registered under this section.
- 8 B. Nothing in this subsection shall may be con-9 strued to authorize the operation of any snow-10 mobile or all-terrain vehicle described in any 11 manner contrary to this subchapter.
- 12 10. Restrictions.
- A. The registration certificate shall be subject to inspection by any law enforcement officer on demand.
- 16 B. The registration number assigned to a snow17 mobile or an all-terrain vehicle shall be dis18 played in such form and manner as the commis19 sioner may determine.
- C. The registrant shall notify the commissioner if a snowmobile or an all-terrain vehicle is destroyed, abandoned or permanently removed from this State.
- 24 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires registration of all off-road motorized all-terrain vehicles and establishes a sep arate registration fee. The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is responsible for administering this requirement which parallels current snowmobile registration requirements.
