- 1. Permit to discharge fireworks. Permit to discharge, fire off or explode fireworks: \$10 \$15 per calendar year;
- 2. <u>Site inspection</u>. Inspection of fireworks display sites: \$5 \$10; and

Each year a number of sponsors of fireworks exhibitions fail to provide an application for fireworks displays in the 15 days required by existing statute. The time required for forwarding applications for such displays has been changed from 15 to 10 days. The bill also increases the license and permit fees for fireworks exhibitions, inspections and permits' discharge.

Additionally, the bill increases the fees for the permits issued for explosives magazines, flammable liquid storage facilities and inspection permits required for vehicles used to transport explosives.
