14 15 16	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE
17 18 19	AN ACT to Require Annual Disclosure of Interest in Agricultural Land in Maine.
20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA c. 2 is enacted to read:
23	CHAPTER 2
24	INTERESTS IN AGRICULTURAL LAND
25	<u>§31. Title</u>
26 27	This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Agricultural Land Interest Act."
28	§32. Definitions

- 1 <u>As used in this chapter, unless the context</u> 2 <u>otherwise indicates, the following terms have the</u> 3 <u>following meanings.</u>
- AFIDA. "AFIDA" means the Agricultural Foreign Investment Disclosure Act of 1978, United States
  Code, Title 7, Section 3501, et seq.

7 2. Agricultural land. "Agricultural land" means 8 any land in Maine which is used or capable of use 9 without substantial modification for production of 10 agriculturally related products including, but not 11 limited to, crops, livestock, poultry, dairy prod-12 ucts, timber, sod and forest and nursery products.

13 <u>3. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Com-</u> 14 missioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources or 15 his authorized agents.

4. Family farm corporation. "Family farm corpo-16 ration" means a corporation founded for the purpose 17 18 of farming and the ownership of agricultural land; the majority of the voting stock must be held by, and 19 a majority of the shareholders must be, persons or 20 21 the spouses of persons related to each other within the 3rd degree of kindred and at least one of the 22 23 related persons must reside on or actively operate 24 the farm; and none of the shareholders may be a corporation. A family corporation does not cease to 25 qualify as such by reason of any bequest of voting 26 27 stock.

- 28 <u>5. Interest in land. "Interest in land" means</u> 29 <u>all forms of direct or indirect ownership of land,</u> 30 <u>except:</u>
- 31 A. A leasehold of less than 5 years;
- 32 B. Contingent future interests;
- 33C. Noncontingent future interests which do not34become possessory upon the termination of the35present possessory estate; and
- 36 D. Surface or subsurface easements and rights 37 of-way used for a purpose unrelated to agricul 38 tural production.

6. Person. "Person" means any individual, cor-1 poration, company, association, partnership, limited 2 partnership, joint stock company, trust, estate or 3 4 any other legal entity. 5 §33. Report required 1. Conditions requiring report. Any person who, 6 on his own behalf or acting as a fiduciary or trustee 7 on behalf of another, holds, acquires or transfers 8 any interest in agricultural land shall submit an 9 annual report to the commissioner not later than 10 90 days after January 1st or the date of that acquisi-tion or transfer, whichever is earlier. 11 12 13 2. Contents of report. The report shall be in 14 such form as the commissioner may require and shall 15 contain: 16 A. The legal name and address of the person 17 filing and type of legal entity; 18 B. The nature of the interest in agricultural land which that person has acquired or trans-ferred and the date of that activity; 19 20 21 C. The legal description and acreage of the 22 agricultural land; D. The use of the agricultural land at the date 23 24 of acquisition or transfer and the use to which the land shall be put by the person acquiring it; 25 26 E. The appraised value of the agricultural land and the consideration given; 27 28 F. The name, address and type of legal entity of 29 the person from whom acquired or to whom trans-30 ferred; and 31 G. Such other information as the commissioner may require by regulation adopted in a manner 32 33 consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375. 34 <u>3. AFIDA report. A person may fulfill the reporting requirement of this section by submitting a</u> 35 36 37 copy of its federal AFIDA report.

## 1 §34. Exemptions

2	1. Agricultural land. A person holding, acquir-
3	ing or transferring any interest in agricultural land
4	shall not be required to comply with the requirements
5	of section 33 in the following situations:
6	A. The agricultural land which is the subject of
7	a single acquisition or transfer is less than 5
8	acres; and
9 10	B. A family farm corporation as defined in section 32.
11	§35. Regulations
12 13 14 15	The commissioner may prescribe regulations in a manner consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, for carrying out the purposes of this chapter.
16	§36. Penalties
17	Any person violating this chapter or regulations
18	adopted thereunder or submitting a report which con-
19	tains information that is false or misleading shall
20	be subject to a civil penalty, payable to the State,
21	of not more than \$50 for each day of the violation.

23	by PL 1971, c. 439, §1, is amended to read:
24	J. Owning real estate <u>, except agricultural land</u>
25	in this State; and
26	STATEMENT OF FACT
27	This bill requires corporations, which are not
28	family farm corporations, to file an annual report
29	providing information regarding ownership of agricul-
30	tural land. Corporations which own less than 5 acres
31	of agricultural land are also exempted from the re-
32	quirement to file an annual report with the Depart-
33	ment of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources.
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
