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STATEMENT OF FACT

30 bill specifically authorizes a hospital The 31 equipment bond program and clarifies that bonds or 32 notes may be issued under the equipment program prior to the obtaining of a Certificate of Need for each 33 34 piece of equipment involved in the bonding package. 35 Each participating institution continues to be gov-36 erned by the Certificate of Need Act with respect to capital expenditures financed by such bonds and re-37 38 quires a Certificate of Need prior to obligating such 39 a capital expenditure.

1 This bill fosters the limiting of health care 2 costs through "packaging" of equipment financings of 3 different institutions, at lower costs and interest 4 rates, while ensuring full scrutiny of the need for 5 such equipment through the Certificate of Need Act.

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
