23 24	Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2803, sub-§7, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 579, §7, is amended to read:
25 26	7. Accept funds and grants. With the approval of the commissioner, to accept such federal funds or
27 28	grants as may be available to carry out the purposes of the academy; and

- 9. Certification of instructors. To certify and set standards for certification of law enforcement and criminal justice instructors to be used in all academy basic and inservice training programs as required by the trustees and over which the trustees have statutory control: and
- 11 Sec. 4. 25 MRSA §2803, sub-§10 is enacted to 12 read:
- 13 10. Revocation or suspension of law enforcement or corrections officer certification. To revoke or suspend a certificate issued under section 2805 or section 2805-A, or a waiver granted pursuant to those sections, through the procedure described in section 2806.
- 19 Sec. 5. 25 MRSA §2806, sub-§1, as repealed and 20 replaced by PL 1977, c. 701, §9, is repealed and the 21 following enacted in its place:
- 1. Power. The board of trustees of the Maine
 Criminal Justice Academy may suspend the right to
 enforce the criminal laws of the State or to act to
 revoke or suspend a certificate issued or a waiver
 granted pursuant to section 2805 or 2805-A, if the
 board determines that the officer:
- A. Is in violation of section 2805;
- B. Has been found guilty of a Class A, Class B or Class C crime or murder;
- C. Has been found guilty of any crime in this or another jurisdiction for which the maximum term of imprisonment prescribed by law exceeds one year;
- D. Has been found guilty of any crime in this or another jurisdiction for which the maximum term of imprisonment prescribed by law is not less

- than 6 months and which involves moral turpitude;
 or
- E. Has been found in violation of section 2805,
 subsection 1, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375,
 subchapters V and VI.
- 7 The board may prohibit a corrections officer from any employment capacity as a corrections officer, if that officer is found to be in violation of section 2805.
- Sec. 6. 25 MRSA §2806, sub-§2, as repealed and replaced by PL 1979, c. 261, §3, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
 - 2. Hearing; procedure. In any case affecting the right of a law enforcement officer to enforce the criminal law, or affecting the right of a corrections officer to be employed as a corrections officer, the board of trustees shall, upon a preliminary determination that the law enforcement officer or corrections officer is in violation of section 2805, subsection 1, conduct a hearing on the applicable facts. The procedure for the hearing shall be in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter IV. The procedure to revoke or suspend a certificate issued or a waiver granted pursuant to section 2805 or 2805-A, shall be in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapters V and VI.

28 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill proposes to give the Board of Trustees of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy the authority to revoke or suspend certificates of training issued to law enforcement or corrections officers. Current law provides, in Title 25, section 2806, that the trustees may in certain cases prohibit these officers from performing their duties in the State, based upon

violations of section 2805. The proposed change would
assure that officers who are certified under our law
could not use that certification to obtain employment
in this State or elsewhere, where good reason exists
to revoke or suspend their certification.
