11	Amend the bill by striking out all of section 2
12	and replacing it with the following:
13	'Sec. 2. 35 MRSA §15, sub-§13-A is enacted to
14	read:

15	13-A. Radio paging service. "Radio paging ser-
16	vice" is a service provided by a communication common
17	carrier engaged in rendering signaling communica-
18	tions. Signaling communication is one-way communica-
19	tion from a base station to a mobile or fixed
20 21	receiver, or to multipoint mobile or fixed receivers
21 22	by audible or subaudible means, for the purpose of activating a signaling device in the receiver or com-
23	municating information to the receiver, whether or
23 24	not the information is to be retained in record form.
25	It is limited to the following types of communica-
26	tions.
27	A. An optical readout paging service consists of
28	a communication of a message to a receiver which
29	displays the message on an optical or tactical
30	readout, either in a permanent form or a tempo-
31	rary form.
32	B. A tone only paging service is designed to ac-
33	tivate an aural, visual or tactile signaling
34	device when received.
35	C. A tone/voice paging service is one on which a
36	tone is transmitted to activate a signaling
37	device and audio circuit in the addressed

1	receiver, following which a voice-grade signal is
2	transmitted, to be amplified by the audio
3	circuitry.
4	Any public utility which operates a radio paging ser-
5	vice shall either maintain a separate set of account-
6 7	ing records with respect to that service or establish
7	a separate subsidiary, the creation of which shall be
8	subject to commission approval and conditions under
9	section 104, subsection 3-A. The commissioner may
10	exempt a public utility from this requirement for
11	good cause shown.
12	Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 3
13	and 4.
14	Further amend the bill by renumbering the sec-
15	tions to read consecutively.
16	STATEMENT OF FACT
17	This amendment clarifies that radio paging is
18	one-way communication. It requires any public util-
19	ity involved in radio paging to keep separate books,
20	but allows the Public Utilities Commission to waive
21	that requirement for good cause, for example a very
22	small company.
