17 18 19	AN ACT to Rejuvenate the Fishing Industry in Maine.			
20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:			
22 23 24	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §3305, sub-§1, ¶I, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 702, Pt. Y, sub-pt. 3, is amended to read:

Act as the public agency of the State for the purpose of accepting and distributing federal funds or other assistance in relation to commu- nity and economic development in those nonentitlement areas and for those projects duly authorized under the United States Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Title 1, and its subsequent amendments. The director may promulgate such rules as deemed necessary to distribute the funds or assistance. These rules			

shall be adopted in accordance with the Maine 1 2 Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 3 375, and shall be consistent with the annual 4 final statement for the State Community Develop-5 ment Program submitted to the Federal Government. 6 The State Planning Office shall give notice in 7 writing of any such rules to the legislative 8 joint standing committee having jurisdiction over 9 appropriations and financial affairs at least 20 10 davs before the hearing, as stipulated in the 11 Maine Administrative Procedure Act, or before the 12 deadline for comments if no hearing is scheduled; 13 and

14 Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §3305, sub-§1, ¶J is enacted to 15 read:

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16 J. Act as the public agency of the State for the 17 purpose of accepting and distributing federal 18 funds authorized under the United States Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, PL 92-583, and its 19 20 subsequent amendments. These funds shall be used 21 for programs related to the protection, enhance-22 ment, conservation and development of the coastal 23 zone of the State. Programs shall include the 24 development of the aquaculture industry in Wash-25 ington County and other counties as appropriate, 26 and the implementation of a development plan for Maine's aquaculture industry. 27

STATEMENT OF FACT

1981, Governor Brennan estab-13 December 29, On 14 lished, by executive order, the "Governor's Task 15 Force on the Economy of Washington County." In October, 1982, the Governor's task force submitted its 16 final report, citing economic development problems of 17 18 Washington County and specifying recommendations for development in the areas of agricultural resources, forest resources, industrial and commercial develop-19 20 21 ment and marine resources. The implementation of 22 those recommendations is compatible with the state's 23 policy for the development of renewable natural 24 resources and would be economically beneficial to 25 eastern Maine.

26 The purpose of this bill is to implement the 27 recommendations of the Governor's Task Force on the 28 Economy of Washington County relating to renewable 29 marine resources.
