17 AN ACT to Increase the Compensation for  
18 Substitute Teachers.  
19

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
21 follows:

22 20-A MRSA §13402, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1981,  
23 c. 693, §§5 and 8, is repealed and the following  
24 enacted in its place:

25 3. Substitute teachers. Substitute teachers  
26 shall be compensated as follows.

27 A. Substitute teachers with 4 years of study  
28 beyond high school, a bachelor's degree and a  
29 teacher's certificate and substitute teachers who  
30 have retired after a minimum of 15 years of  
31 teaching shall be compensated at the rate of not  
32 less than \$50 for each day of service, except  
33 that if such a substitute teacher teaches in

1 excess of 5 consecutive school days, the substi-  
2 tute teacher shall be compensated at a daily rate  
3 not less than 75% of the unit's average teacher  
4 daily salary for each consecutive school day of  
5 service in excess of 5 days.

6 B. All other substitute teachers shall be com-  
7 pensated at the rate of not less than \$35 for  
8 each day of service, except that if such a sub-  
9 stitute teacher teaches in excess of 5 consecu-  
10 tive school days, the substitute teacher shall be  
11 compensated at a daily rate not less than 60% of  
12 the unit's average teacher daily salary for each  
13 consecutive school day of service in excess of 5  
14 days.

15 STATEMENT OF FACT

16 The purpose of this bill is to increase the com-  
17 pensation for substitute teachers and to provide that  
18 if a substitute teacher teaches on a long-term basis  
19 the compensation will be based on a percentage of the  
20 unit's average teacher daily salary.
