17 18 19	AN ACT to Allow the Election of Members of the Board of Assessment Review.
20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22 23	<pre>Sec. 1. 30 MRSA §2060, sub-§6, ¶B, as reenacted by PL 1973, c. 695, §1, is amended to read:</pre>
24	B. The board of assessment review shall consist
25 26	of 3 members to be appointed by the selectmen or
26 27	to be elected by ballot. A municipality may designate that members of the board of assessment
28	review be elected by ballot at a town meeting
29	held at least 90 days prior to the annual meeting
30	or, in municipalities without a town meeting, by
31	referendum. A referendum to determine if the
32	members of the board of assessment review shall
33	be elected by ballot shall be held pursuant to
34	the procedures established in paragraph H. The

town, when adopting such board, may fix the com-1 2 pensation of the members. One member shall appointed for one year, one member for 2 years and one member for 3 years, and thereafter the 3 4 5 term of each new member shall be 3 years.

Sec. 2. 30 MRSA §2060, sub-§6, ¶H is enacted to 7 read:

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Notwithstanding any provision of a municipal charter to the contrary, the qualified voters of a municipality, except where the legislative body is a town meeting, may provide by referendum for the election of the members of the board of assessment review. Upon receipt of a petition signed by qualified voters of the municipality equal in number to at least 10% of the total number of qualified voters voting in the last gubernatorial election, the legislative body of the municipality shall submit the referendum question to the legal voters of the municipality. The petition shall be filed at least 90 prior to a regular municipal election. referendum question shall be submitted to the voters at a special election held at least 60 days prior to a regular municipal election. A public hearing shall be held on the referendum question by the municipal officers at least 10 days before the special election. The referendum question shall read as follows:

"Shall the Board of Assessment Review be elected by ballot?"

The voters shall indicate by a cross or mark placed against the word "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the question. The Act shall be approved by a majority of the legal voters voting at the special election.
