8	Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Attorneys Searching and
9	Certifying Title to Real Estate."
10 11	Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "§3-311." by adding at the end the following:
12	'Nothing in this section shall be construed to
13	require certification of title to a lender if that
14	lender does not so require, or to a land title insur-
15	ance company if that company does not so require.'
16 17 18	Further amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated " $\underline{\$439}$." by adding at the end the following:
19	'Nothing in this section shall be construed to
20	require certification of title to a financial insti-
21	tution if that institution does not so require, or to
22	a land title insurance company if that company does
23	not so require.'
24	STATEMENT OF FACT
25	The bill provides that the consumer's attorney
26	who performs a title search may also certify title.
27	It makes clear that the mortgage lender may choose
28	either to accept the attorney's certification or
29	instead require land title insurance.
30	The purpose of this amendment is to avoid exces-
31	sive attorney fees by clarifying that the law does
32	not require certification of title. Presently, an
33	attorney who is an agent for a land title insurance
34	company does not typically certify title to the com-

pany. If this law were interpreted as requiring cer tification in these cases, there would be increased
costs to the consumer.
