STATEMENT OF FACT

28 The purpose of this bill is to amend the law dealing with the granting of easements of state-owned, submerged and intertidal lands. The bill 29 30 31 would permit the granting of easements for lands adjacent to piers, wharves and docks on state land and 32 33 land contained within the bounds of structures like 34 lobster pounds or fish weirs which are on land leased 35 from the State.
