1 2 3	1. Notification of the board. A landowner shall insure that the board is notified, within a time frame prescribed by the board, as to:
4	A. The intent to apply pesticide;
5	B. The pesticide or pesticides to be used;
6	C. The approximate date of intended application;
7 8	D. The geographical boundaries of the intended target site; and
9	E. The intended application rate.
10 11 12 13	2. Notification of the public. A landowner shall insure that the public is notified through media requirements established by the board, within a time frame established by the board, as to:
14	A. The intent to apply pesticide;
15	B. The pesticide or pesticides to be used;
16	C. The approximate date of intended application;

19 20	E. The source of more detailed information and spray schedule, if desired.
21 22 23 24	3. Notification of the Maine Poison Control Cen- ter. A landowner shall insure that the Maine Poison Control Center is notified, within a time frame established by the board, as to:
25	A. Intended pesticide use;
26	B. The intended application rate; and
27	C. The boundaries of any intended target site.
28	Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §1471-R is enacted to read:
29	<u>§1471-R. Fees</u>

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1	In order to monitor notification and application,
2	each retail sale of a pesticide shall be taxed at the
3	rate of one cent per dollar value to a maximum of 50¢
4	per container. Taxes shall be collected by the
5	retailer and shall be paid over to the Pesticide Con-
6	trol Fund.
7	The board may, by rule, exclude certain pesti-
8	cides or classes of pesticides from taxation by
9	virtue of their low potential for causing human or
10	environmental harm or their low potential for requir-
11	ing board monitoring.
12	STATEMENT OF FACT
13	The purpose of this bill is to require notifica-
14	tion of intent to apply pesticides. The bill also
15	imposes a fee of the retail sale of pesticides in
16	order to provide funds to monitor notification and
17	application.
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
