Sec. 2. Appointment. The members shall 1 be appointed as follows: The 2 members of the House 2 of 3 Representatives shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; the Senate member shall be appointed by the President of the Senate; 2 admin-4 5 istrators shall be appointed by the University of 6 Maine Chancellor; one administrator to be appointed 7 by the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Ser-8 9 vices; the faculty, students, professional and clas-10 sified members shall be elected by the respective bodies in the University of Maine system; the alumni 11 12 and public members shall be appointed by the Gover-13 nor. The Governor shall appoint the chairman of the 14 commission.

15 Sec. 3. Duties. The commission shall evaluate 16 the cost and performance of higher education, with 17 specific attention paid to:

18 <u>1. Faculty.</u> The quality and morale of faculty; 19 the recruitment, retention and promotion of faculty; 20 and the impact of collective bargaining;

21 <u>2. Decision making.</u> The planning and decision-22 making processes of institutions of higher education;

23 <u>3. Service.</u> The delivery of services to stu-24 dents and the general public by institutions of 25 higher education; the costs of the delivery of educa-26 tional services; and the costs of administration;

<u>4. Quality of education.</u> The overall quality of
education offered at these institutions; the appro priateness of the curriculum for needs of students,
the State and the Nation; and

31 <u>5. Other matters.</u> Such other matters and con-32 siderations as the commission shall deem appropriate 33 in providing to the Legislature a full and accurate 34 picture of the subject matter of higher education in 35 this State.

36 Sec. 4. Staff assistance. The commission may 37 hire outside consultants to gather information, con-38 duct interviews and undertake any other activities 39 necessary to fulfill the commission's charge. The 40 commission may hold any public hearings it deems

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1 appropriate in obtaining information deemed neces-2 sary.

3 Sec. 5. Report on findings and recommendations. 4 The Commission on Higher Education shall complete its 5 work and report it findings and recommendations and any necessary implementing legislation on or before 6 January 1, 1985, to the First Regular Session of the 7 112th Legislature. This report shall address each of 8 9 the matters set forth in this Act and shall include 10 any proposed legislation in proper draft form to be adopted by the Legislature to effectuate the course 11 12 of action the commission may recommend.

13 Sec. 6. Compensation. Members shall be compen-14 sated at \$40 for each day or part of a day they par-15 ticipate in commission business, plus reasonable 16 travel expenses.

17 Sec. 7. Appropriation. The following funds are 18 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 19 purposes of this Act.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

24 The purpose of this bill is to establish a com-25 mission to review and evaluate higher educational 26 needs and institutions in Maine. This will be the first major study of higher educational in 27 Maine 28 since the formation of the University of Maine system 29 in 1968. The commission is directed to report to the Legislature with its report and recommendations for 30 31 legislative action by January 1, 1985.

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
