17 18 19 20	AN ACT Relating to the Appointment of the Board of Visitors of the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf.
21 22 23	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
24 25 26 27 28	Whereas, it has been recognized that the input of private citizens regarding the operation of the Gov- ernor Baxter School for the Deaf is important to the school's function and the need for a Board of Visi- tors to be appointed immediately; and
29 30 31 32 33 34	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preser- vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
35 36	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

1 Sec. 1. 20 MRSA §3122, sub-§4, as amended by PL2 1977, c. 325, §1, is further amended to read:

3 4. Governor Baxter School for the Deaf. The Governor Baxter School for the Deaf, established by 4 5 chapter 446 of the private and special laws of 1897 6 and by chapter 44 of the private and special laws of 7 1953, is to be devoted to the education and instruction of deaf children. The school shall be located in 8 9 the County of Cumberland and the State shall have the 10 entire charge, responsibility and expense of main-11 taining the school. The government of the school is 12 vested in the Department of Educational and Cultural 13 Services, which shall have charge of the general 14 interests of the school and shall see that its 15 affairs are conducted in accordance with law. The 16 department may employ officers, teachers and other 17 employees as it may deem advisable subject to the Personnel Law. The department may prescribe the sys-18 19 tem of education and course of study to be pursued in 20 the school.

21 Any child between the ages of 5 and 20 years, as de-22 fined in section 3123, subsection 1, diagnosed as 23 deaf, shall be educated with regular students when-24 ever possible and shall be educated under the prin-25 ciple of the least restrictive educational alternative as set forth in state and federal laws and requ-26 27 lations.

28 The superintendent of the administrative unit in 29 which such child resides, with the consent of the 30 child's parent or legal guardian may enroll such 31 child in the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf and support of such child 32 the sums necessary for the 33 while attending the school shall be paid by the 34 Department of Educational and Cultural Services in 35 accordance with its guidelines and regulations.

36 It shall be the responsibility of the Governor Baxter 37 School for the Deaf to provide annual evaluation of 38 all children enrolled in the school. These evalu-39 ations shall be sent to the superintendents of the 40 administrative units from which such children are enrolled. Each administrative unit may request tech-41 42 nical assistance from the Governor Baxter School for 43 the Deaf in matters relating to the education of deaf 1 children in accordance with guidelines and regula-2 tions of the department.

3 The Governor shall appoint a Board of Visitors to review and make recommendations relative to the man-4 5 agement of the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf. The board shall have access to the school, but shall 6 7 not be authorized to participate in the administration of the day-to-day operations of the school. The 8 board shall make annual recommendations to the com-9 missioner relative to the management of the school 10 with copies being sent to the members of the joint 11 standing committee of the Legislature having juris-12 diction over education. 13

14 The members of the board shall be appointed for ro-15 tating 3-year terms. The initial appointments shall 16 be 2 members for 3 years, 2 members for 2 years, and 17 one member for one year. All future appointments 18 shall be for 3-year terms. No member of the Legis-19 lature may serve on the board. The board shall serve 20 without compensation.

21 Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §7503, sub-§8 is enacted to 22 read:

8. Board of Visitors. The Governor shall 23 24 appoint a Board of Visitors to review and make recommendations relative to the management of the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf. The members of the board 25 26 27 shall be appointed for rotating 3-year terms. The initial appointments shall be 2 members for 3 years, 2 members for 2 years and one member for one year. 28 29 All future appointments shall be for 3-year terms. 30 No member of the Legislature may serve on the board. 31 The board shall serve without compensation. 32 The board shall: 33

34A. Have access to the school, but shall not be35authorized to participate in the administration36of the day-to-day operations of the school; and

37B. Make annual recommendations to the commis-38sioner relative to the management of the school39with copies being sent to the members of the40joint standing committee of the Legislature hav-41ing jurisdiction over education.

Sec. 3. 34 MRSA §41, as amended by PL 1977, c.
564, §127, is further amended to read:

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§41. Membership; rights and recommendations

4 A board of 5 visitors, as heretofore established, shall be appointed by the Governor, in connection 5 6 with each state institution under the department and 7 the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf within the Department of Educational 8 and Eultural Services. 9 These visitors shall be appointed for a term of one year and shall be eligible for reappointment. 10 No 11 member of the Legislature shall serve on any Board of Visitors. The members of the Boards of Visitors shall receive no compensation. Each Board of Visitors shall 12 13 14 have the right to inspect the institution to which it 15 assigned and to make recommendations relative to is 16 the management of said institution to the commis-17 sioner. Copies of all recommendations shall be sent 18 to the members of the Health and Institutional Ser-19 vices Committee of the Legislature and each Board of 20 Visitors shall appear before the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Institutional Services upon 21 22 request.

23 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 24 cited in the preamble, section 1 and 3 shall take 25 effect when approved and section 2 shall take effect 26 July 2, 1983.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

28 This bill ensures that a body of lay persons will 29 in constant contact with the Governor Baxter be 30 School for the Deaf regarding its operation and 31 effectiveness. Since it is emergency legislation, both Title 20 and Title 20-A will be affected. Also, 32 33 this bill relocates the authority for a board of 34 visitors from Title 34, which governs the operations of the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retar-35 dation, to Title 20 and 20-A which govern the opera-36 37 tions of the Department of Educational and Cultural 38 Services.

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
