20	§21. Definitions
21	As used in this subchapter, unless the context
22	indicates otherwise, the following terms have the
23	following meanings.
24	1. Election. "Election" means any primary, gen-
25	eral or special election for the nomination or elec-
26	tion of municipal, county or state officials. "Elec-
27	tion" may not include referenda.
28	2. Employee of this State. "Employee of this
29	State" means an employee in the classified or unclas-
30	sified service, as defined in sections 671 and 711,
31	but shall not include an employee identified under
32	section 711 subsection 1 paragraphs A B D and F

2	means	an	election	other	than	a	partisan	elec	tion.

- 4. Partisan election. "Partisan election" means an election in which a candidate may be nominated or elected as a representative of a party, as defined in Title 21, section 1, subsection 21.

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#### An employee of this State may not:

- 9 1. Interfere with an election. Use his official authority or influence for the purpose of interfering with or affecting the result of an election;
- 2. Coerce political contributions. Directly or indirectly coerce, attempt to coerce, command or advise another employee of this State to pay, lend or contribute anything of value to a party, committee, organization, agency or person for political purposes; or
- 3. Solicitation from state property or during working hours. Solicit or request a payment, loan or contribution of anything of value to a party, committee, organization, agency or person for political purposes during that employee's state working hours, on the property or premises owned by the State or using the facilities, equipment or services of the State.
- 26 §23. Permitted political activity
- An employee of this State may:
- 28 <u>1. Candidate in nonpartisan election. Be a can-</u>
  29 didate for office in a nonpartisan election;
- 2. Candidate in partisan elections. Be a candidate for office in a local or county partisan election, if, prior to filing as a candidate, he receives

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1	a written statement from his appointing authority
2	that he is not a "state or local officer or
3	employee," as defined by the United States Code, Title 5, Section 1501, as amended; and
4	Title 5, Section 1501, as amended; and
5	3. Participation in political campaigns. Except

12	A violation of section 22 is a Class E crime.

15	STATEMENT OF FACT
16 17	The purpose of this amendment is to clarify this bill. The provisions of this amendment are:
18 19	1. Prohibit state employees from interfering in an election;
20 21	<ol><li>Prohibit state employees from coercing political contributions;</li></ol>
22 23 24 25	3. Prohibit state employees from soliciting political contributions during their working hours, on state property or by using state facilities, equipment or services;
26 27 28	4. Allows all state employees to run for nonpartisan elective office, and allows nonfederally funded state employees to run for partisan elective office as well and

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5. Allows state employees to actively partici-

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pate in political activities to the extent not. specifically prohibited by this amendment. 2 The definition of state employee in this amend-4 ment includes all classified and unclassified employ-5 ees, but specifically excludes elected officers, constitutional or legislatively elected officers, judi-6 cial officers and employees, legislative officers and 7 employees, and officers and enlisted men of the 8 National Guard or Naval Militia. The definition of election excludes referendum 10 11 elections. 12 The prohibitions, for state employee participa-13 tion in political activities contained in this amendment, follow the language and policy of the federal "Hatch Act;" except for the provision allowing candi-14 15 dacy in partisan elections and the prohibition on 16 using state working hours or facilities, equipment 17 18 and services for political activity.
