17 18 19 20	The purpose of this amendment is to remove additional officers and employees in the unclassified service from coverage in that part designated section 22 in House Amendment D.
21 22 23 24	This amendment allows certain state employees to run for nonpartisan elective office and allow nonfederally funded state employees to run for partisan elective office.
25 26	This amendment allows these rights to the following groups:
27 28 29	1. Heads of departments and members of boards and commissions required by law to be appointed by the Governor, some bureau directors and the secretary of the Public Utilities Commission;

- cipals of the school systems in state vocational schools and state institutions; and

- Employees excluded under section 21, subsection 2, who are employed by an agency or department funded by or in receipt of federal moneys, would be subject to the provisions of Title 5, United States Code, Sections 1501 to 1508, Hatch Act.
