1 is required to provide for sufficient personnel to ensure efficient administration of the program. 2 The 3 extent and the magnitude of this program will be 4 determined by the Commissioner of Human Services and 5 will be determined on the basis of the calculated 6 need of the recipient population and the available 7 funds. The department is may not authorized to spend 8 more on the conduct of this program than is available 9 either through appropriations from the General Fund, 10 dedicated revenue, federal or other grants and other 11 established and committed funding sources. The commissioner is authorized to may accept for the pur-poses of carrying out this program federal funds 12 13 carrying out this program federal funds 14 appropriated under any federal law relating to the furnishing of free or low cost drugs to the disadvan-15 taged, elderly individuals and to do such acts as are 16 necessary for the purposes of carrying out such federal law; and to accept from any other agency of gov-17 18 ernment, individual, group or corporation such funds 19 as may be available to carry out this chapter. 20

The commissioner is authorized to may adopt rules and regulations relating to the conduct of this program. These rules and regulations shall be promulgated in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, and shall be related to the following aspects of this program:

Prescription and nonprescription drugs. The

41 4. <u>Method of prescribing or ordering drugs</u>. The 42 method of prescribing or ordering such drugs which 1 may include, but not be limited to, the use of 2 generic prescribing and the use of standard prescrip-3 tion refill sizes so as to minimize operational 4 costs;

5 4-A. <u>Payment for drugs provided</u>. The commis-6 sioner may establish the amount of payment to be made 7 by recipients toward the cost of prescription or 8 nonprescription drugs **and**, medication <u>and medical</u> 9 <u>supplies</u> furnished under this program; and

10 5. Other rules. Such other rules and regulations 11 as may be necessary to efficiently and effectively 12 manage and operate a program within the intent of 13 this section.

14 The Commissioner of Human Services shall estab-15 lish, or shall require the person responsible for 16 administration of this program to establish, a planned program of solicitation of funds and, drugs 17 and supplies for this program from agencies of gov-18 ernment, individuals, groups and corporations. A register of solicitations shall be kept, which shall 19 20 include at least the name, address and business of 21 the agency, individual, group or corporation from whom funds and, drugs and supplies are solicited, as 22 23 well as the date, time and result of the solicita-24 tion. This register shall be a public record and 25 26 shall be sent to the Governor every 6 months for his 27 inspection.

28 The department is also authorized to may form an 29 advisory committee which it may consult for technical information regarding the nature and operation of 30 31 this particular program. The nature and composition 32 the advisory committee shall be at the discretion of of the Governor, or at his direction, at the discre-33 34 tion of the Commissioner of the Department of Human 35 Services. The members of such that advisory committee shall serve without compensation; hewever, the 36 37 department is authorized to may disburse funds from an account created pursuant to this section to defray 38 39 the reasonable costs associated with formulation of 40 policy and the carrying out of activities of this 41 committee. The department is further authorized to may disburse funds from the account set up to carry 42 43 out the purposes of this section to reimburse members

1 of the advisory committee for their reasonable 2 expenses incurred in carrying out their duties under 3 this section. In no circumstance shall may expendi-4 tures of over \$3,000 per year be incurred for the 5 operation of this committee and all such expenditures 6 must be approved by the Governor.

7 The Commissioner of Finance and Administration is 8 authorized to may create a dedicated revenue account 9 to receive moneys pursuant to this section from what-10 ever source is available which money may be disbursed 11 solely for the purposes of implementing this section.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

13 This bill enables the Department of Human Ser-14 vices to expand the low cost drugs for the elderly 15 program to include such medical supplies as deter-16 mined by the commissioner based on recipient need and 17 availability of funds.

This bill provides greater flexibility in the 18 19 hiring of staff to administer the low cost drugs for 20 the elderly program. At the time of the establish-21 ment of the program, the Bureau of Medical Services 22 exist as a unit within the Department of did not 23 Human Services. Since then, the Bureau of Medical Services has been established and has assumed respon-24 25 sibility for administration of this program. As an 26 integral and on going function of administering this and other medical assistance programs, the bureau 27 retains several professional consultants, including a 28 29 physician, dentist and pharmacist.

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
